Reading at home will make a HUGE difference in your child's school success.

Please read for at least 10-15 minutes every day and make it fun!

- Read in fun places!
- Use audio books to take an adventure on a car ride!
- Talk about what you read together and build a love of reading!



Help your child LOVE drawing and writing!

- Every child scribbles first...appreciate it hang it up!
- Use a wide range of writing tools...pens, markers, chalk, etc.
- Tracing letters, numbers, shapes is a great way to help young writers.
- Make it FUN and stress-free!



Children develop positive feelings about math when they have math fun at home with their family!

- Count, read numbers, explore shapes, create patterns and measure!
- Celebrate and praise ALL math discoveries!
- Read counting books, count steps, and play board games that use counting (like Candyland, Chutes and Ladders, and Uno)!



Gross motor skills: Before students can hold a pencil, they need to strengthen large muscles by playing on the monkey bars, swimming, or even building forts. Play is how children learn to discover their world!

Fine motor skills: Help your children increase control and hand strength in fun ways! Encourage your child to:

- Hold scissors the correct way (thumbs up!).
- Have fun with play dough, legos, dominos and blocks; string beads or noodles.
- Trace, draw shapes and write letters. Make it FUN and hands on!
- Pick up cotton balls, seeds, or rocks with clothes pins, as this is a fun way to build hand strength. Finally, work on buttoning, zipping, and tying shoes!

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Reading at home will make a HUGE difference in your child's school success. Please read for at least 10-15 minutes every day and make it fun! Read in fun places, read in fun ways, read different kinds of books, and read about different things! Talk about what you read, ask questions, make predictions, and build a love of reading!



Help your child LOVE drawing and writing! Writing should be fun and stress-free! Allow your child to draw & write at their level. Make writing fun - use pencils, pens, chalk, markers & crayons. Encourage your child to write letters, draw shapes/pictures and various types of lines. Tracing is a great way to help young writers!



- **Fine motor skills:** Help your children increase control and hand strength by encouraging them to hold and use scissors the correct way (thumbs up!); have fun with play dough, legos, dominos and blocks; string beads or noodles, trace stencils or trace around objects; draw shapes and write letters. Make it FUN and hands on!
- **Letters**: Help your children learn the letters (and their sounds!) capital and lower case starting with those in their own name.
